JOB DESCRIPTION: CHILDREN'S MINISTER

We're seeking someone with a passion for inspiring children in their faith, helping them grow into who God is calling them to be. This role is about **creativity, connection, and discipleship**—working with local schools, volunteers, and families to share the gospel and equip children to live out their faith.

Key Objectives

- **Connect More Children and Families to Faith in Jesus:** Use creative outreach to engage unchurched families and integrate them into the St Peter's community.
- **Deepen Children's Spiritual Lives:** Provide discipleship opportunities that help children grow as lifelong followers of Jesus.
- **Equip and Encourage Families:** Support parents and carers in raising children who live out their faith daily.
- **Develop Leaders:** Inspire and empower young people and volunteers to grow in leadership roles within the church.

Main Duties & Responsibilities

Relationships

- Build and maintain strong relationships with children, families, and volunteers.
- Recruit, train, and equip volunteers to lead effectively across children's ministry activities.
- Provide pastoral care to families, referring to additional support where needed.
- Ensure children are active participants in church life, enabling them to share their voices and ideas.

Discipleship

- Plan and lead engaging, age-appropriate weekly sessions that teach children key Christian beliefs and practices.
- Support volunteers in delivering these sessions, providing high-quality resources and training.
- Be a positive role model, demonstrating what it means to live a life of faith.
- Create social media content to connect with families and share discipleship tools, such as parenting-for-faith resources.

Families

- Equip and inspire parents and carers to disciple their children.
- Develop outreach events and opportunities that welcome families into the church community.

Schools

- Maintain and grow relationships with local schools, providing assemblies, lessons, and other engagement opportunities.
- Seek creative ways to share the good news of Jesus with pupils, staff, and parents.

Services and Events

- Collaborate with the Youth Minister and other staff to develop intergenerational worship experiences.
- Plan and deliver events that foster community, encourage friendships, and provide opportunities for outreach.
- Lead annual initiatives, such as holiday clubs, special services, and family-focused celebrations.

Administration

- Ensure safeguarding policies are adhered to, working closely with safeguarding officers.
- Organise ministry logistics, including volunteer rotas, communication with families, and budget management.

Support and Provision

- **Mentorship:** Line management and guidance from the Vicar, with the additional option of a separate mentor for further support.
- **Resources:** Office space, laptop, and reimbursed expenses.
- **Development:** Encouragement to pursue relevant training opportunities to grow in the role.

Main Terms and Conditions

- **Hours:** Full-time, 40 hours per week. Flexible or part-time arrangements may be considered.
- **Salary:** £28,000–£31,500 per annum (dependent on experience).
